Both Milton and Anne will be included in the annual Memorial Mass each November where their names along with all deceased members and wives of Council 7014 are read aloud as we remember them all.
- KC HALL IS TAKING SOME BOOKINGS for 2021. The Red Cross Blood Drive scheduled for April was postponed and a limited capacity Confirmation ceremony took place on April 10th. In May there are plans for the RVFD fundraiser on May 15th and The Go Texan fundraiser in September. As conditions improve, there is much interest in hall usage. Fundraising events by other community groups that normally use our hall has suffered as well.
- **KC BINGO** as we all know has been suspended since covid started. Last March (2020) was our last game. With the restrictions imposed (crowd size, social distancing, masks, barriers, etc.) bingo just was not practical. Since then, our bingo license has just come due to be renewed. Bingo chairman, Tom Alejandero, had three options: Not renew and let the license lapse, renew for one or two years with no fee to keep the license current. The officers decided to renew the license for the two-year term and we would not actually be required to hold bingo games.
